PARISH FINANCE COUNCIL GUIDELINES

The Parish Finance Council met on Thursday. The following is a statement about the role and operation of the PFC.

The Parish Finance Council instigates and maintains a financial management system for the Parish, including a budget. The PFC works within parameters of current assets, projected income and expenditure and material parish needs. It

monitors and reviews income and expenditure as required. It makes recommendations to safeguard and maintain Parish assets, both real and fixed, and also ensures appropriate health and safety standards are met on Parish property. The PFC is a consultative body and as such strives to operate in a supportive and collaborative role with the Parish Priest in the interests of the Parish and within guidelines laid down by the Archdiocese. This is in keeping with the co-responsibility of the laity in the mission and ministry of the Church.

The management of the Parish Budget is about:

- Accountability
- Supporting planning by providing predictability of resources for the year (ensuring adequate income)
- Focussing resources on identified areas of needs and priority
- Maintenance of programs to which we are committed

Budget Allocation Process

The Parish does not have unlimited funds, so we must spend money wisely and well. There are some fixed costs in the Parish that we cannot reduce eg rates, insurance, mandatory support for the Archdiocese, power, water, administration costs, liturgy costs, health and safety issues, etc. These items *must* be given first priority. When these priorities have been met, we then consider issues such as essential repairs, replacement and maintenance as well as new equipment.

From time-to-time the Parish will also need to consider major developments eg new Church, new shed, solar panels, data projectors, photocopier replacement, etc. Other items that parishioners would like to bring to the attention of the PFC for consideration are welcome. Such issues need to be in writing, submitted through community PFC reps and preferably on the appropriate form. All parishioners are encouraged to come up with ideas to generate income. Budget submissions are due to the Parish Office by the last Tuesday in November for consideration at the next meeting.

Purchasing Policy

All purchases must be made in accordance with the Budget, taking into account best value for money, avoidance of nepotism, etc. All purchases (including emergency expenditure) must be made after consultation with the Finance Manager, who will organise all Parish payments and manage the cash flow as necessary. In an emergency eg vandalism, theft, significant damage, etc contact the Finance Manager, Parish Finance Council Chair or Treasurer who will instigate appropriate action, including contacting the insurance company if necessary.
