Jesus said to the Jews: 'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.'

Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said. Jesus replied: 'I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you. Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him. As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.'

## DID YOU KNOW?

- Gathering together to break bread and share the cup is the most ancient practice of the Church. Paul wrote a description of "The Lord's Supper" in 1 Corinthians 11:23 in about the year 56.
- This feast, which used to be known as 'Corpus Christi' originated in the Middle Ages as a celebration of the real presence of Christ in the Eucharistic bread.
- In John's Gospel, the Eucharist is instituted by Christ in the sharing of the loaves and fishes, not as the Last Supper which he had with his friends on the night before he died. For John, the central act of that last Supper was the washing of the feet of the disciples - an act of service to others.

## THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST - YEAR A

Today is the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, also known under the Latin title of Corpus Christi. Every Mass is the Mass of the body and blood of Christ. In today's liturgy, we reflect on the gift Christ left his Church.

### FIRST READING

Deuteronomy 8:2-3; 14-16 Moses addresses these words the people as a reminder of how God lavished his love on them. This is especially notable in the sending of manna, the bread from heaven, an anticipation of the Eucharist.

### RESPONSORIAL PSALM

*Praise the Lord, Jerusalem.*

### SECOND READING

1 Corinthians 10:16-17 St Paul reflects on the communion shared in the body and blood of Christ. We form a single body because we share one bread, one cup.

### GOSPEL READING

John 6:51-58 These are the solemn words of John's presentation of the discourse of Jesus on the Bread of Life. The bread he gives is his flesh for the life of the world.

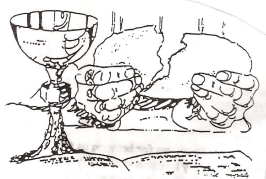
## FIRST FRIDAY MASSES

From next weekend we, along with other parishioners in the Adelaide Archdiocese, will be using the New Missal. The blue insert with this Bulletin sets out the new responses, etc that we will be using. From next weekend we will also have new overheads and other materials to help ease us into new system.

## *The Liturgy of the Eucharist.... us becoming the body of Christ*



In fact, in the Liturgy of the Eucharist, the changes will affect what you hear more than what you say.

Over the years, the priests have developed a familiarity with the Eucharistic prayers and in many cases memorised them so they, too, will need time to develop a familiarity with the new.

On the enclosed sheet you will notice some of the changes to our responses. However, just a comment on two of them:

1. Our prayer " Lord I am not

worthy" echoes the prayer of the Centurion who believed himself unworthy to have Jesus come to his house. It now reads:

***Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.***

In a way, it is a homely gesture to think of the Risen Jesus coming to our house.

2. The acclamations after the consecration. Each of the three options is a prayer to the Risen Jesus, present in the Eucharist. They are not just a statement about Jesus.

***a. We proclaim your death O Lord and profess your Resurrection until you come again.***

***b. When we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim your death O Lord until you come again.***

***c. Save us, Saviour of the world for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free.***
