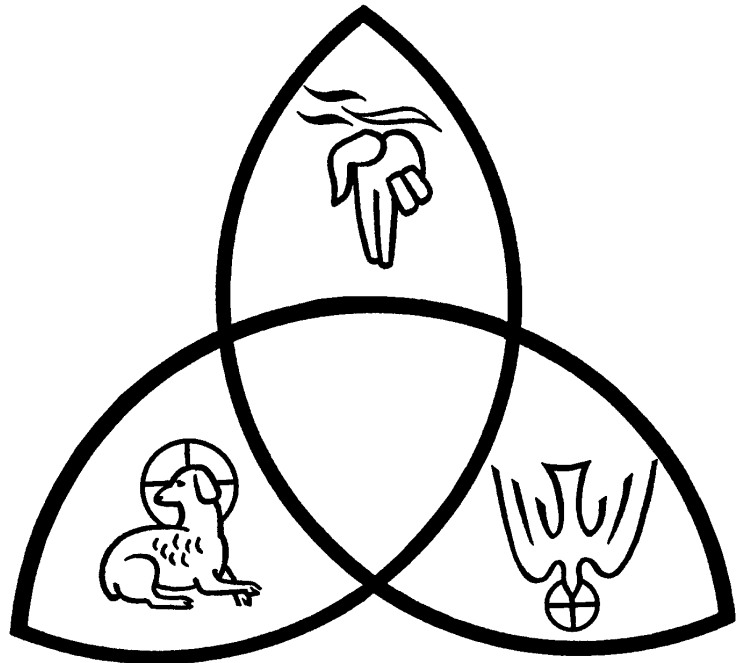

## DID YOU KNOW?

- From earliest times the Church pondered the relationship between the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Doctrine of the Trinity, most eloquently defined at the Council of Chalcedon (451AD) as three persons in one God, is the result of this.
- Theologians today continue to contemplate the mystery of the Trinity.
- ‘The Mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and of Christian life. God alone can make it known to us by revealing himself as Father, SDon, and Holy Spirit’ (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 261).
- St Patrick is reputed to have attempted to explain the mystery of the Trinity as God who is three-in-one by using the shamrock as a symbol. Another commonly used symbol of the trinity is the triangle.
- Our God is relational. Humans, created in tессicаhe image and likeness of God. are created to be in relationship with others.

### RESPONSORIAL PSALM

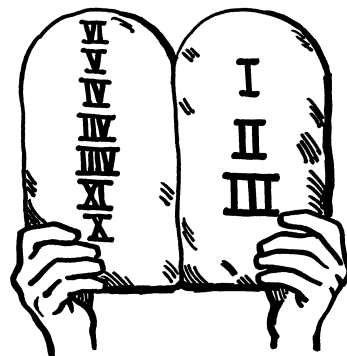
*Glory and praise for ever!*

## NEW TRANSLATION OF ROMAN MISSAL

*"The Nicene Creed" and  
"Apostles Creed"*

The Creed can be either in the form of the Nicene Creed or The Apostles Creed. Our personal faith is expressed when we begin saying, "I believe". Both Creeds are Trinitarian in form.

The Nicene Creed was originally formulated by the Council of Nicaea

in 325 to ensure unity in fundamental beliefs.

While our current creed is still named Nicene, it has over the centuries been expanded to form a text that expresses our common faith with more precision. Since the sixth century, the Nicene Creed has been incorporated into Baptismal and Eucharistic liturgies.

The revised text of the Nicene Creed has a lot of wording change because of return to a literal translation of the original Latin.

Archbishop Wilson has decided that in this Archdiocese, as a norm, we will use the Apostles' Creed on Sundays and feast days and only use the Nicene Creed on very particular celebrations.

The Apostles' Creed: The Apostles' Creed is clearly the fruit of the early Christian Tradition. It, too, has a history indicating the church's understanding of its faith. Most of us know the Apostles' creed as a devotional statement of our faith. Both Creeds are very much our profession of faith at Baptism

**THOUGHTS ON THE GOSPEL**

“Two is company, three is a crowd.” “It takes two to tango.” “Just the two of us.” If there are two people, there is community; if they belong to one another, they are somehow fulfilled in the way that no solitary person is. We think of two as the natural number.

Yet the teaching of Christianity, its deepest conviction, is that three is the true number of relationship, not two. How can that be?

Jesus said 'Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them' (Matthew 18:20). What he is saying is that if there are two gathered together, there is also, by the nature of things, three. The two

can only be two because there is between them a *relationship*, and this is the third thing.

Of its nature, there is indeed no past tense in the verb 'to love'. The Trinity is the proof of this. In our world, lots of things are alienated from their own nature. Lots of things are, in the deepest sense, not quite themselves. This is why we seek redemption. This is why the Holy Trinity is the sign of our redemption. With them, the two are always three, because the two are always in love, and love is in them, and one day, by their grace, there will be love for all, without a past tense.
