COMMUNITY WORKSHOP

A community workshop to discuss the Aldinga township streetscape and gateways concept plan will be held on Thursday, 29 September from 7.00pm - 8.30pm in the Aldinga Institute Hall, Old Coach Road, Aldinga.

The purpose of the workshop is to:

- give an overview of the project (background to the project, project objectives, project scope, community engagement opportunities and timing)
- look at the character of the village (what you like and what can be improved in the streetscape)
- set up a community reference group (a group of approximately 8 people to input into the design process).
