## GOSPEL

*(Read at the procession before Mass)*

### Matthew 21:1-11

When they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, ‘Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find an ass tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, “The Lord has need of them,” and he will send them immediately’. This took place to fulfil what was spoken by the prophet, saying,

‘Tell the daughter of Zion,  
Behold, your king is coming to you,  
humble and mounted on an ass,  
and on a colt, the foal of an ass’.

The disciples went and did as Jesus directed them; they brought the ass and the colt, and put their garments on them, and he sat thereon. Most of the crowd spread their garments on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. And the crowds that went before him and that followed him shouted,

‘Hosanna to the Son of David!  
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!

Hosanna in the highest!’

And when he entered Jerusalem all the city was stirred, saying, ‘Who is this?’ And the crowds said, ‘This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth of Galilee’.

The Lord has given me a disciple’s tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me with speech. Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple. The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed.

Sr Margaret Ann agreed (*reasonably willingly!!*) to be first off the block and give us a bit of an insight into her earlier years.

## MY STORY .....



I was born in 1943 in Beechworth, Victoria, the eldest child of Margaret and Ted Connelly. Since it was wartime and my father was serving in the RAAF, I spent the first three years of my life with my mother and my grandparents, in her family home, in Beechworth. In this environment, as their first grandchild, I was the centre of attention for my grandparents, Bessie and Tom and for Bridie, Syd and Cecily, mum's siblings who were living at home at the time. After WW11 I moved with my parents to Port Pirie where my father had work in the BHAS and where his family lived.

Four more children were added to our family – one boy who lives now in WA and three girls who all live in Adelaide.

Our mother always said the Pirie was a great place to bring up children. We would ride our bikes everywhere and had a very happy and carefree childhood. I was educated at St Mark's School which was staffed by the Sisters of the Good Samaritan, and when I felt called to Religious Life I entered the Order. The Pirie nuns never mentioned that there were any other Religious Orders !!

I did my teacher training in Sydney and as a 'one year wonder' (as they were known then). I taught in schools in Sydney, Wollongong and Queanbeyan, New South Wales, and in Coorparoo and Mitchelton in Queensland. As was the custom in those days I continued my own education 'part-time'. When my studies were finished I took a position with the Catholic Education Office in Townsville as a consultant in Religious Education for the schools in the western region of the diocese. This entailed much travel along the Flinders Highway to places like Julia Creek, Mt Isa and Winton, and the culling of several 'roos along the way!

I moved to Adelaide in 1998 as my parents were ageing, and that's where I became involved in Religious Education at St John's School, Christies Beach and in the Noarlunga-Seaford Parish. I have since become engaged in pastoral ministry in the Willunga Parish for the past few years and love living in this beautiful 'Gateway to the Fleurieu'.

### VALE - JIM FITZPATRICK (30/12/1924 - 24/3/2020)

James Fitzpatrick was the oldest child of Charles and Elizabeth Anne Fitzpatrick. He and his younger three siblings were all baptised in St Joseph's and the family were regular Church-goers for many years. Jim's brother Terry married Beverly Lovelock at St Joseph's in 1956 and brother Michael married Carmel McCormack in St Joseph's in 1968.

Jim went Willunga primary school and after a short time at high school worked as a projectionist. At 18 he enlisted in the Armed Forces, being accepted into the RAAF. He aspired to be a pilot, but pilot training diminished in the latter years of the war and he made Leading Aircraftman. He was stationed for a while at Wedge Island radar station and then at Point Cook. His father, a returned Lighthorseman from WW1, died in Willunga in 1944. The last time Jim saw him was as they walked to the Willunga train station when Jim left for Point Cook.

Jim later worked for the PMG, played football and cricket for Willunga and did night school to get his electrician's licence and also draftsman skills. He also took flying lessons later and eventually realised his dream to fly. Jim was employed in the Department of Navy for many years in Canberra, then with a related department in Melbourne. For several years before that he performed the important role of being Santa Claus' helper in Christmas pageants and fetes in Willunga. Jim kept fit and umpired football at league level in Canberra and district Melbourne. He would keep fit in Willunga running up Taylor's Hill.

As their parents died while they were quite young, Jim, Terry, Michael and Mary were very close all their lives, even when working far apart. Jim had a very strong attachment to the Church and was Sacristan for 30 years after returning to Willunga. He was an almost daily communicant and spent many hours helping in the Church as well as being involved around the town.

His final years were at Eldercare, Seaford, where he received tremendous care. When he first arrived there he joined many locals he knew. Sadly many others passed on ahead of him and his awareness diminished greatly. His sister Mary regularly visited and was the last person to help him eat before he passed away. He was very well liked and highly regarded as a fair-minded, friendly and helpful person who did much in service of his country, his community and the Church.



he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

### GOSPEL

**Matthew 26:14-27:66**

*(Heavily abridged)*

The Passion of our Lord, Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

From the sixth hour there was darkness over all the land until the ninth hour. And about the ninth hour, Jesus cried out in a loud voice, ‘Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani’, that is, “My God, my God, why have you deserted me?” ...But Jesus, again crying out in a loud voice, yielded up his spirit.

At that, the veil of the Temple was torn in two from top to bottom ... Meanwhile the centurion, together with the others guarding Jesus, had seen the earthquake and all that was taking place, and they were terrified and said, ‘In truth this was a son of God’. And many were there watching from a distance, the same women who had followed Jesus from Galilee and looked after him. Among them were Mary of Magdala, Mary the mother of James and Joseph, and the mother of Zebedee’s sons.

When it was evening there came a rich man of Arimathea, called Joseph, who had himself become a disciple of Jesus. This man went to

Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Pilate thereupon ordered it to be handed over ...

### DID YOU KNOW?

- The words of Jesus from the cross in this text are in Aramaic, the language Jesus spoke.
- The name Barabbas literally means son (bar) of the father (abba). Here the crowd chooses the false son while condemning the true Son.
- This Sunday is also known as ‘Palm Sunday’ and commemorates Jesus’ triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Celebrations similar to those carried out in churches today (*in normal times*) were being held in Jerusalem as early as the fourth century.
- The narratives of the Passion of Jesus – the arrest, trial, crucifixion and death – are the earliest strands of what came to be written down as the gospels.
- Since the fourth century the site now marked by the Church of the Holy Sepulchre has been revered as the site of Calvary.
