
TRIVIA AFTERNOON RESCHEDULED


SYNOD OF BISHOPS

Alas, these dumbbells are closer to revealing our natural inclinations than we care to admit. We step up to drink the cup of Christ in our Eucharist without much fuss, but when it comes



time to share his passion in even the smallest sense, we don't respond to roll call. We're willing to take part in the rituals of religion, but we're nowhere to be found when it's time to ransom. Servant-hood has little appeal. Still we're prepared to join in the finger-pointing at James and John seeking credit. We, at least, cover our aspirations a little better than they do.

FIRST COLLECTION

The funds we contribute to the first collection each week are the primary means of sustaining our Priests, Deacons and retired Priests in our 55 parishes. Together with stole offerings – that is, the payments made to clergy for weddings, funerals and baptisms – all funds are paid into the Diocesan Presbytery Fund. This fund provides our priests' stipends, medical benefits, motor vehicles and continuing education. The fund also provides support for our retired and sick priests and the Priests and Deacons working in the Archdiocese. Our clergy rely totally on the first collection for their material needs and sustenance. Their workload is increasing and in our fast growing secular society demand for the services provided by the Catholic Church and its clergy has never been greater.

COMPLIANCE WITH COVID-19 REGULATIONS

(Current from 12 October, 2021)

- Places of Worship are restricted to 3 people per 4 square metres with social distancing of 1.5 metres. The number of people at a Private Activity has increased from 50 people to 150 people, provided density requirements are met. If more than 50 people are present, there must be an independent COVID Marshal. QR codes and/or handwritten logs are essential.
- Wearing of masks is mandatory. Wearing of masks in parish offices is strongly recommended.
- Attendees at indoor religious services may sing during worship and members of choirs or chorus groups may perform or rehearse indoors, if they wear masks while doing so.
- Recommendation from Archdiocesan Office that tea/coffee after Mass be suspended.
- Social distancing is mandatory - DO NOT CONGREGATE at entry/exit and outside.
- There should be no shaking of hands or holding hands during the Mass.
- Every gathering must record contact details - either with the QR code for smart phones, or the handwritten log - both located at the entrance to the Church
- Hand sanitizer is available at Church entrances.
- Offertory procession will be omitted. Communion is given only in hands. Precious Blood will not be distributed.
- Collection plates will not be passed around.
- Holy Water is not available at the doors of churches.
- All surfaces should be cleaned at least daily, with special attention given to frequently touched surfaces.
- Sick and high risk/vulnerable people should be encouraged not to attend.
- The Archdiocese recommends Covid vaccination for all (please check with your GP if you have concerns).

When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them, 'You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt.

This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all.

For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'



PROMISE ME THIS

"Mum, I want to ask you a favour. Promise you'll say yes?" "Wait a minute, dear. I can't say yes until I know what you're asking me. So, what is it?" "I'm afraid to tell you because I know you'll say 'no' and I need you to say 'yes'. So just say 'yes,' OK?" "No!"

Have you ever had a conversation like that with your kids? It's common enough. Kids want what they want when they want it and don't want to submit to the wisdom of their parent's authority. A couple of the apostles acted like that with Jesus. James and John, the sons of Zebedee, had the authority to say to Jesus, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you". They had plans for themselves. They wanted to reserve prime spots for themselves in Jesus' kingdom. They had no idea what they were asking. They just thought about what they were going to get, not what they would need to give - which is everything including their very lives.

Sometimes that's true with our children. They have no idea of the consequences involved in what they're asking from us. As parents we need to guide them along the way, being neither too quick to say yes or no.



EXPLORING THE WORD

On three occasions, Jesus has told his disciples of his approaching passion and death. Here James and John enthusiastically, if somewhat naively, commit themselves to following him in drinking the cup and undergoing the baptism that Jesus faces. Do they really understand the cost of discipleship? Their question to Jesus would indicate that they have still not fully grasped what it means to follow Jesus. They want him to do their will rather than them doing the will of the Father. They still seem to be thinking in terms of a political and earthly kingdom, where power and riches will come to those who are in special places of favour at the right and left hand of the ruler. Instead, Jesus offers them a share in his suffering and death. The other disciples too display their human weakness in their indignation that they may be left out. Jesus tries again to make it clear to his foolish disciples that their view of the world, locked as it is in their earthly experience, is not how God plans things to be.
