FIRST READING

Acts 1:1-11

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom of Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'


God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord.

Thomas Tuohy

For 15 years from 1882, Thomas Stephen Tuohy was a parishioner at St Joseph's and the local policeman. He was born in Woodforde, Ireland in 1852 and came to South Australia in 1857 as a child with his five siblings and parents, Denis and Anne. The family settled at Hindmarsh and Thomas's education began at the first Catholic school established in the district. He completed his formal education at St Patrick's, West Terrace. In 1874 Thomas joined the mounted police and was posted to Two Wells and then Mallala, where he married Miss Mary Gertrude Delaney of Gawler. After 5 years at Mallala, Tuohy was transferred to Willunga where he, Mary and their 8 children remained for 15 years, living on the premises of the Willunga Court House and Police Station. Five of his

children were born during their time in Willunga. As well, Mary nursed Thomas' father, Denis, at the police station, during his long and painful illness. Denis died there on 20 June 1885 and is buried in St Joseph's Cemetery, Willunga.

career in Willunga was distinguished by two dramatic events in South Australian history. Firstly, in 1886, he helped investigate the Yankalilla Bank Robbery, where malefactors broke into the premises of the Yankalilla Bank Manager, tied him up and robbed the bank.

Two years later, on 13 July 1888, Constable Tuohy displayed tremendous courage rescuing people from the Star of Greece shipwreck. The wreck is a story of tragedy and heroism. On 13 July 1888, Star of Greece was bound for England. caught in a violent storm, and wrecked off the beach at Pt Willunga. A witness recounted that he saw Tuohy 'divest himself of a portion of his uniform, dash into the heavy breakers ... which were ten to twenty feet high', risking his life again and again in his efforts to rescue drowning sailors. At least eighteen sailors lost their lives in the wreck. Tuohy recalled 'the terrible scenes' and the subsequent visit of the select committee appointed to enquire into the disaster. As a result of his actions, Tuohy was awarded the Royal Humane Society Silver Medal and a medal especially commissioned. It had the following engraving, "Presented to Mounted Constable Tuohy in recognition of brave conduct in saving life at the wreck of the Star of Greece, Pt Willunga, 13 July 1888.

W.J. Peterswald, Commissioner of Police"

After working in Tanunda, Clare and Adelaide, Thomas retired in 1919. He died at his home in Kent Town in 1935 at the age of 84, survived by Mary and six remaining children. Two of his children predeceased him. 13th July 2023 will be the 135th anniversary of the wreck of the Star of Greece.

COMPLIANCE WITH COVID-19 REGULATIONS

- Collection plates are to be passed around with minimum contact



DID YOU KNOW?

- The Ascension of Jesus is described only in the Book of Acts (1:2-11), although there is a shorter version in Luke's Gospel. There are also allusions to the event elsewhere in the New Testament, eg Jn 6:62; Eph 4:8-10.
- In Matthew's Gospel, many of the important moments of Jesus' life are located on mountaintops his temptation, his transfiguration, the great teaching of the 'sermon on the mount', and now this final instruction to his disciples. In this way, Matthew draws parallels with Moses the great leader and lawgiver who encountered God on the mountaintop.
- Matthew shows Jesus as fulfilling and extending the teaching of Moses. Whereas the Law had been for the people of Israel, Jesus sends his disciples to all nations; whereas the Jewish people had faith in the name of God, YHWH, Jesus sends his disciples to baptise in the name of the Father, Son and Spirit.
- The celebration of the Ascension as a particular feast day developed in the vicinity of Antioch around 380 AD.

Alleluia, alleluia! Go and teach all people my gospel. I am with your always, until the end of the world. Alleluia!

GOSPEL

Matthew 28:16-20

The eleven disciples set out for Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had arranged to meet them. When they saw him they fell down before him, though some hesitated. Jesus came up and spoke to them. He said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you. And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.'



DON'T JUST STAND THERE: DO SOMETHING

(Mark 16: 15 - 20)

The Ascension of Jesus is an event recorded three times in the New Testament: at the end of Luke, the beginning of Acts, and here, in what's called the longer ending of Mark. (Early manuscripts record several different endings to his gospel.) In each version of the Ascension story, Jesus has different final instructions for the disciples – the ones in "longer Mark" being the most colourful. But in every account we have, Jesus tells the disciples to go and be witnesses of the gospel they have received. On this point, all three speak in one voice. It would seem this mission is non-negotiable.

How we do that is up to us. If we want to knock on doors or preach in the park, suit yourself. If you feel drawn to foreign missions, the

prayer of the church will support you. Maybe the least missionized corner of the world is right where you are. Do you have good news to share?

When you show up, is it "good news" for those around you? How do you demonstrate the gift of faith that's been given to you?


